We need to know this because: It helps us to understand how different artists can influence movements and other artists.

We will be able to be inspired and influenced by art movements when we create our own artworks.

Once you have designed and sketched your art work, you need to think about the type of media that you want to use.

Mixed Media

A combination of different media can give you more ways to express yourself. It can be as simple as combining drawing and painting or creating a collage using a variety of different papers to work with paint or ink.

It is interesting to explore collage techniques, or to use found objects in your work. This can be a quick and easy way to try out lots of different combinations and arrangements.

Types of media that you could use:

Painting

Collaging/decoupage

Watercolours

Oil pastels

Crayon

Textured paper

Discuss appropriate use and give children time to plan/think it through

We are going to have four stations set up for you to use. Each section will have a different type of media that you can add to your clock!

Types of media that you could use:

Station 1: Poster paint

Station 2: Collaging/decoupage (tissue paper)

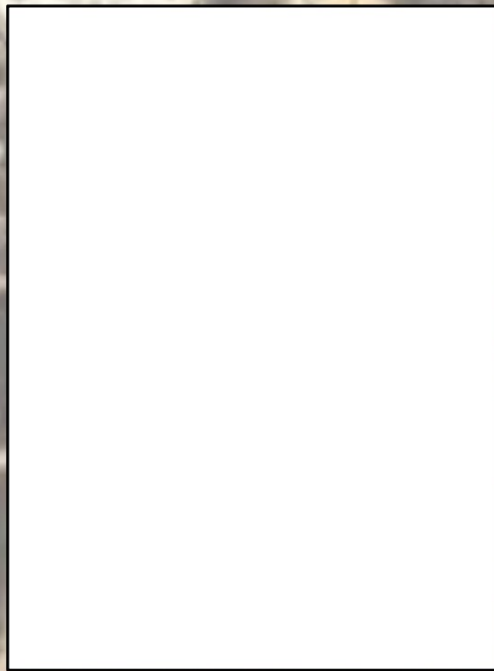
Station 3: Watercolours

Station 4: Oil pastels
