Once a month we open Enginuity early for families whose children would benefit from visiting at a quieter time and wherever possible will have adjusted operations and/or lowered volume levels on exhibits.

There is no upper or lower age limit for this, but children under 14 must be accompanied by an adult. **Numbers are limited to reduce noise.**

Sessions begin at 8:30am and lasts for 90 minutes.

Free for annual pass holders, £2 per child otherwise. One adult free of charge per paying child, additional adults and children pay £2.

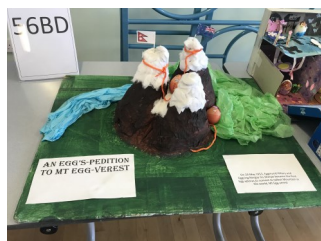

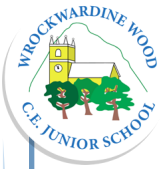

His sister left months ago. Now his brother has disappeared too, and Ebo knows it can only be to make the hazardous journey to Europe.

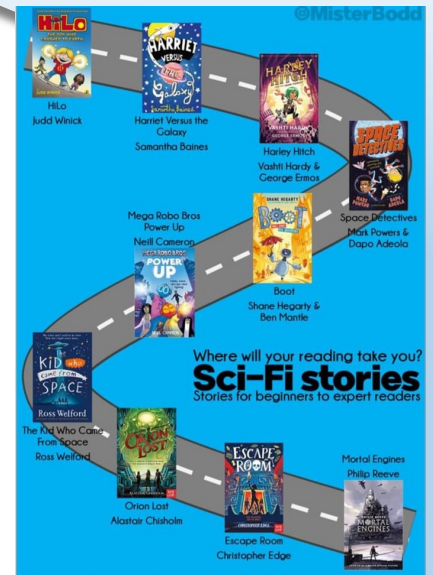
