Finally, we do have a leave in <u>term</u> <u>time</u> page on our website that details our stance on taking children out of school for term time holidays. We follow national and local guidelines of a 'blanket no policy' but if you are considering taking your child out of school for a term time holiday, we do encourage you to submit a <u>leave of absence in term time</u> form to the headteacher so individual circumstances can be considered. In deciding whether or not to grant the request for leave of absence the headteacher and governors will consider if leave of absence should be granted due to the exceptional circumstances relating to that request. Please allow enough time for the processing of your application before making any travel arrangements. (DfE guidance states schools should not authorise leave retrospectively).

#### Safer Internet Day

Over the years, Safer Internet Day has become a landmark event in the online safety calendar. Starting as an initiative of the EU Safe Borders project in 2004 and taken up by the Insafe network as one of earliest actions in 2005, Safer Internet Day has grown beyond its traditional geographic zone and is now celebrated in approximately 170 countries worldwide. The theme this year is 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. On Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> February it was Safer Internet Day, so to acknowledge the importance of online safety, each class completed a lesson on how to stay safe online. The theme for this year's Safer Internet Day was all about navigating online change and managing influence, therefore years 5 and 6 considered a range of scenarios in which young people were influenced by content online and gave advice on how to tackle the pressure that can come from being online. As well as this, each class in year 5 and 6 used the iPads to play a Cyber Security game where the pupils had to answer questions regarding how to keep personal information private and avoid any online dangers. Finally, our Digital Leaders delivered an assembly on what Safer Internet Day is all about, how young people can stay safe and who they can talk to when online change or content makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable.
