At Wrockwardine Wood C.E Junior School, your child's well-being, safety, academic and social development continues to be of upmost importance. We recognise the importance of and value in parental involvement both within and beyond the classroom and want to ensure that as a school we work effectively with our parents and the local community.



In our ongoing commitment to ensure that we continue to provide the most effective support to all our students and parents/carers, we are excited to introduce a new parent/carer working group- **Parents in Partnership**. As a working group we will identify parental strengths and incorporate them in to planning events and projects that will give a sense of achievement and satisfaction to all involved.
