Wraparound Care



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Our wraparound care provision started this week and has been a big success! The children and staff have all enjoyed being together and we are sure it will continue to go from strength to strength. We would like to say a huge thank you to Mrs Brayne and Miss Doody!

If you would like your child to attend, please complete a booking form (available online or in reception) and return to school with a payment at least one week in advance.

The children can either have a bowl of cereal or toast with a drink in the mornings and a piece of fruit and a drink in the after school club. If they stay for the second session 4:40pm-5:30pm, they can also have a snack if they wish. The cost of the provision is £2.50 per day for breakfast and £3.50 for after school session 1 (3:20-4:30) and £3.50 for session 2 (4:30-5:30)
