Wraparound Care

The children and staff are all enjoying our breakfast and after school sessions. The children are having fun using the equipment and games in there and joining in with games with children in other year groups which is great.

If you would like your child to attend, please complete a booking form (available online or in reception) and return to school with a payment at least one week in advance.

The children can either have a bowl of cereal or toast with a drink in the mornings and a piece of fruit and a drink in the after school club. If they stay for the second session 4:40pm—5:30pm, they can also have a snack if they wish. The cost of the provision is £2.50 per day for breakfast and £3.50 for after school session 1 (3:20pm—4:30pm) and £3.50 for session 2 (4:30pm—5:30pm)










Forest School—3H and 4W
