Anti-Bullying Week at WWJS

We have spent time each day this week shining a light on bullying and the steps that we can take together to stop it. The theme for this year's campaign is 'One Kind Word' - a theme that

seems more important than ever. The isolation of the last year has underlined how little acts of kindness can break down barriers and brighten the lives of the people around us. With this in mind, we have completed a Kindness Challenge each day to remind ourselves of the importance of being kind.

Our PSHE lesson this week has focussed specifically on bullying and what we can do if we or someone around us is being bullied. We ended our lesson by creating a piece of artwork that represents us, with the idea that we are all different, but all equal. These will be used to create a whole school display that celebrates our commitment to anti-bullying and diversity.



Anti-Bullying Workshops

The workshops we carried out focussed on forming healthy relationships in school. We spoke about the impact of one unkind word and one kind word and the effect that has on others. We carried out an experiment using a jug of clear water. We asked the children to put in just one drop of ink and everyone saw the effect that had on the water turning everything blue. We explained that the ink represents just one unkind word and once spoken, can impact the whole class and is impossible to take away.

To mark Anti-Bullying week, Wrockers Safety Squad have created a child-friendly Anti-Bullying leaflet and are delivering the below message to all our children:

We know that bullying can happen anywhere, and we want everyone in our school to feel happy and safe all the time, so we have made this booklet so that everyone knows what to do if they are being bullied or see bullying happen. From Wrockers' Safety Squad
