Learning

To show that God will never forget us, the Bible uses picture language and tells us that it is as if our name is written on the palm of His hands.



Respond



Reflecting

Think of someone special to you, who you will never forget.

Trace their name on the palm of your hand with a finger from your other hand. It doesn't matter if you're not sure of the spelling - God will know who you are thinking about.

Close your eyes and imagine the person's face.

Close your hand holding that person safe, and say a silent prayer to thank God for them.
