#### Youth Café - Year 6

Here in year 6, we have been lucky enough to be visited by the Youth Cafe (Anti-Terrorism police officers from West Mercia Police). These police officers dedicate time to educating young people in schools covering important topics. Today, we covered: knife crime, drug use along with county lines and radicalisation.

To kick start our session we took part in a fun ice breaker session where we answered questions to warm up. The police then went on to share information with us firstly about knife crime. We were encouraged to think about why young people carry knives, a clip helped us to understand that carrying a knife is never an option and it always ends badly.

We then viewed pictures of celebrities in their prime and then after a year of using drugs – it was shocking!! They looked awful and had serious skin and teeth problems. Following this, Alice (who was awesome!) was chosen to take part in a role play that demonstrated how county lines works around the country. The police showed us how older people get children involved in drug/ gun/ gang and knife crime by firstly offering them money and gifts, but when they have had enough or the child makes a mistake, the drug dealers can become very nasty and harm the child and their family.

We finished the session looking at radicalisation and how important it is to SPEAK UP and tell an ADULT if we are ever approached in any of the above situations. We learned that being involved with knives, drugs, guns, terrorism and gangs rarely ends positively.

We would like to thank Sunny and James at West Mercia Police for coming into school for the day working with us!
