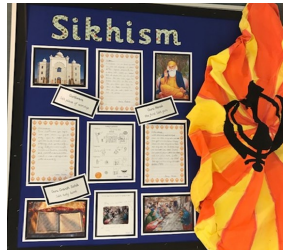
Preparing for our return to school:
