COVID-19 Reminder:

Whilst rates of Covid-19 in the area are decreasing, we must remain vigilant. Please can you continue to contact school via email a3129@telford.gov.uk if a member of your family are being tested or test positive. This email address will be monitored over the weekend and during the Easter holidays for this purpose. If you, your child or another member of your family are being tested, you should all stay at home until you get the result.

The main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are:

- a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

You should also get a test if you or any of your family have any of these 'precautionary' symptoms:

- Headaches
- Aches and pains
- Feeling very tired for no good reason
- Sore throat
- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Tummy ache in children

If anyone has any of the small yellow plastic eggs from inside Kinder eggs after Easter, please could we have them for our First Aiders to keep their gloves in. Thank you!

When booking for these precautionary symptoms, make sure you answer the question 'Why are you asking for a test?' with 'My local council or health protection team has asked me (or someone) I live with to get a test, even though I do not have symptoms'
