Here is an idea for a quick, active and fun activity you could carry out with your family this weekend! We hope you enjoy!


#### 6 in a Row



What you need: 6 shoes, two dice, a line marker e.g. dressing gown rope or a line on the floor and two or more players.

#### How to play:

- Place the 6 shoes in a row on the line.
- The two players begin at opposite ends of the shoes with one dice each.
- The shoes are numbered 1 6 from each player's end so one player's #6 will be their opponent's #1 etc.
- Roll the dice and run to the shoe with the corresponding number. Move that shoe to the right side of the line.
- Run back to the dice and roll again.
- The winner is the player to have all 6 shoes on their right of the line, or whomever has the most shoes in 4 minutes.
- Make this easier by playing first to four shoes.

Applying for a Secondary School for current year 6 pupils

Current Year 6 parents must apply for a secondary school place by Friday 31st October 2025

#### Reminders for parents:

- Apply for up to 4 schools to maximise the chance of receiving a preferred offer.
- Listing only 1 preference increases the risk of being allocated a school far from home.
- Late applications are unlikely to secure a place at popular schools.
- The application deadline is 31<sup>st</sup> October 2025 for all secondary school applicants.
- This deadline also applies to all children with an Education Health Care Plan.

#### **TTRockStars**

TTRockStars is also a really useful platform for children to practise and deepen their multiplication knowledge. Multiplications in KS2 play an instrumental role in lots of aspects of Maths. They are more than just a classroom skill—they are foundational building blocks for many areas of learning. From solving everyday problems to understanding advanced mathematical concepts, multiplications underpins other subjects too. Regular practice helps children develop fluency, confidence, and accuracy which in turn supports their progress in school and beyond. Each week, each class are set tournaments to complete and battle against other year groups; the most valuable player per each year group will be rewarded with a prize and certificate presented on Fridays.

🗏 Important Update: Penalty Notices for Term-Time Absence

Dear Parents and Carers,

The Local Authority has asked us to share their information leaflet regarding Penalty Notice regulations for termtime absences, which came into effect nationally on 19th August 2024. You can find this leaflet on our website under the Leave for Absence section:

We've summarised some key points from the leaflet below:



Requesting Leave of Absence

All requests must be made using a Leave of Absence form, available from school.

Only the Headteacher can authorise leave, and only in exceptional circumstances.

If leave is not authorised and the child is absent, a Penalty Notice may be issued.

If the school has not received a leave of absence request and the child is absent without an authorised reason, a home visit welfare check will be triggered, and a Penalty Notice may be issued.




**New National Threshold** 

A Penalty Notice must be considered if a child has 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10week period.

In some cases, fewer than 10 sessions may still trigger a fine.

For example, if a parent deliberately avoids a Penalty Notice by taking their child out of school during a week with only four pupil days (e.g. when a PD day or bank holiday shortens the week), a fine may still be issued.


#### **Celebrating Amazing Homework Achievements!**
